17. Administratively Approved: Reinstatement of the MS degree in Epidemiology, starting in Spring 2013. This degree had been suspended by the Provost's Office from Fall 2011 until Spring 2013 so that the two departments in the two colleges involved (Medicine and Public Health and Health Professions) could merge and develop appropriate infrastructure. The overall requirements of the degree remain at 36 credits, with some changes to specific curricular items, so Graduate Council approval was not deemed necessary.
