CERTIFICATES:

2. **Proposal from the College of Medicine for a new graduate certificate in Medical Pharmacology and Therapeutics (#12869).** Dr. Steve Munger was present for discussion.
GC Member: I notice all of the associated courses are pending in the approval system. Will they be ready in time for the certificate?
Dr. Munger: The courses have already been approved by the Graduate Curriculum Committee and are pending with the Registrar's office.
Dr. Duncan: If the courses have not been given permanent course numbers by the time the certificate is ready to be offered, the unit can temporarily offer the courses under a special topics number.

3. **Proposal from the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences for a new graduate certificate in Medical Geography and Global Health (#12338).** Dr. Jane Southworth was present for discussion. A motion to approve was made, seconded, and passed unanimously.
